Understanding our digital communications ecology: "We are all post-McLuhan in the Twenty First century"

She will argue that our common future depends on understanding our collective and individual relationships to the ?communications ecology? that we have made, and in which we live, as McLuhan observed, 'often as unconsciously as the fish in water
